



### BRYSONWOOD FARM & FERME AVICOLE BRYBEC

Brysonwood Farms (crop production) was purchased by Douglas Bryson and his wife from his parents and he had transitioned the fields to organic production.

After winning the New Poultry Producer startup program, Douglas took on new challenge and started his start up poultry operation, Ferme Avicole Brybec in 2021.

Total acreage of the farm is 330 acres with almost all of it tillable land, roughly 15 acres is woodland. All the soils are a clay loam, with a rotation of corn, beans, cereals and green peas for bonduelle.

Ferme Avicole Brybec has a 40x200 three story chicken barn with 28,000 broiler chickens per batch, 6.5 batches annually for a total production of 420,000 kg.

Even the poultry operation is new to him, Douglas has been dedicating his hours and passion in running the farm.



He is the only one full-time employee on the farm for now. He also has help and support from his wife and a kind neighbor whom he works closely with.

## **SUNTOR HOLSTEINS ENR**

Suntor Holsteins ENR is owned by Kevin Sundborg and Amanda Lukassen. The family business first started when Kevin's grandfather purchased an abandoned farm in 1965. Kevin's dad Fred started beef farm around 1970. In 1973 he sold the beef and purchased grade dairy cows. The family started milk cows in tie stall facility.

In 2015, Kevin and Amanda decided to purchase the farm from Kevin's parents. With their shared passion and big goals, they expanded their business into a new milking robot facility. Construction for a new facility started the summer of 2016. In spring 2018, they modified part of the old tie stall into a group housing calf facility with a robot milk replacer feeder.

They own 330 acres of land and milk around 80 Purebred Holsteins and jerseys with 20 kg of Quota owning. They raise all of their replacements. 70% are bred to beef and all beef crosses are sold at sale barn. Suntor Holsteins is proud to have main robot dairy barn and have most of their field work done by custom operators.
