1. General Rally Rules:

a.	The competition is open to all members from Quebec 4-H clubs, as well as any invited clubs.
b.	All ages are as of January 1 st of the year of the Rally. Non-host club participants must be aged 10-25 years old to participate at Rally. All members aged 10-11 and 6-9 from the host club may participate in all sections so long as they are accompanied by an adult. The adult may be a screened member of legal age
	(18+). The adult may be a chaperone to no more than 2 members aged 11 and under, other than their own children. Members ages 6–25 who cannot attend Rally may send life skills entries with their club. The
	points for all 6–11 year-olds will NOT count towards the club aggregate.
с.	<u>NO ALCOHOL AND/OR ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES</u> is allowed on the fairgrounds. See Quebec 4-H Provincial and General Activities Policies.
d.	Participants may not stay at the fairgrounds unless camping on site has been approved by the Board. They will be billeted with a 4-H family if they desire, or are expected to find their own lodgings. The barns and the life skills buildings will be closed to participants and adults from 11:30 p.m. to 4:00 a.m., only security people designated by Quebec 4-H will be allowed in restricted areas during those times.
e.	All placings stand as read until published by Quebec 4-H.
f.	A participant may enter projects in more than one section, but only one may count for points. The highest scoring project will be used for their individual aggregate score.
g.	No competitor shall interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties. Upon the discovery of any fraud, dishonest practice or misrepresentation in regard to any exhibit which may have been intended to influence the decision of the judges, the Executive Committee has the power to withhold any points gained by the participant(s) involved, as well as to suspend the offending party(ies) for up to a period of three years.
h.	While the Directors and Executive of Quebec 4-H will take every precaution against accidents on the fairgrounds, the owners and exhibitors must themselves take all risks of loss or damages to or by their stock or manufactured articles while in exhibition. All persons run risks of accidents, including fire and theft, while on the grounds.
i.	Anyone failing to comply with the rules of the Provincial Rally may be suspended from participating in the event, at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
j. k.	Participants cannot enter the same project/entry (with the exception of horses) for more than two consecutive years without a request for exception being submitted 14 days prior to the registration deadline, which then must be accepted by the Programs and Regulations Committee. Each Club must submit the name and contact information of one chaperone who will be present at the Rally.
κ.	This chaperone will be the "Assigned Chaperone".

2. Financial & Registration Policies

a.	Pre-registration for participants and projects can be processed through AssistExpo by May 12 th , 2024 (11:59PM). The fee due at pre-registration is \$120 per participant. The fees are non-refundable. In the case of emergency or exceptional circumstances, a participant who must cancel may send a letter explaining their reasons to the Financial Committee to be considered for a refund.
b.	No changes of project type will be allowed within 10 business days prior to the first day of Rally. In the case of exceptional circumstances, a request must be submitted to the Executive Committee.
C.	Participants who send Life Skills entries to Rally with their club but who do not attend Rally in person shall pay the \$20 project fee only.
d.	A late registration fee of \$20 will be charged to all entries received after May 12 th , 2024, up until May 26 th , 2024.
e.	No registrations will be accepted after May 26 th , 2024.
f.	A weekend meal package (Thursday supper to Sunday breakfast) will be available for all non-participants for \$85. A banquet meal ticket (Saturday supper) will be available for all non-participants for \$30.
g.	The cheque for hay and shavings must be received by a Quebec 4-H staff before the club is allowed to pick up their hay/shavings.

3. Public Speaking Competition:

a.	Public speaking topics, including those suggested by other organizations, shall be approved by the Programs and Regulations Committee and supplemented by topics determined by the host club.

d.	Contestants may use a flip chart or appropriate poster to illustrate their speech but must provide them.		
	Slides, films, videos or overhead projectors will not be allowed.		
e.	The overall winner will be encouraged to participate at the CYSA competition.		

4. Life Skills Competition:

a.	Members may send their Life Skills entries with their club and are not obliged to be at the Rally for the weekend.
b.	All items MUST have been prepared/made by the participant.
c.	A participant must enter a total of four (4) classes prepared prior to Rally plus one (1) live competition completed at Rally to be able to receive full points. All participants must compete in the live competition if they are on the site of Rally, of no points will be awarded for that entry.
d.	To earn full points, competitors will be required to complete a 5 th entry on site during Rally. The category will be announced beforehand, unless otherwise decided by the host club. Specifications and supplies will be provided at registration on the Thursday evening of Rally or during the supervised class on Friday. Entries must be submitted no later than 12:00 noon on Friday.
e.	From the list of categories, the host club will propose 8 to 10 class specifications to the Programs and Regulations Committee for approval. Except for the one compulsory class to be completed at Rally, participants may choose which classes they enter Vegetables- Flowers- Potted Plant- Photography- Drawing/Painting- Sewing- Handicraft- Woodworking- Food (no tasting)- Collection- Other category suggested by host club and approved by Programs and Regulations Committee
f.	Articles will be judged based on the following 50 marks for effort 25 marks for theme 25 marks for presentation for a total possible 100 marks per article.

5. Judging Competition:

a.	The judging competition will take place on the Friday of Rally.
b.	The competition is open to all participants aged 10 – 25 years old as well as 6 - 9 year-olds from the host
	club.
с.	Each class will be 12 minutes, unless otherwise indicated.

d.	This is an individual effort. Any participant(s) caught talking will receive a warning, and if caught a second time during that particular class, their card will be destroyed for that class. Any participants caught cheating will have their cards destroyed for that class.	
e.	Participants present at the Rally must judge all classes.	
f.	f. JUDGING COMPETITION CLASSES:

6. Fitting Competition:

a.	Only one team per club may be entered in each section i.e. Dairy/Beef/or Sheep if sufficient number of
	animals can be made available by host club. All animals provided will be halter broke and all dairy heifers will
	be of the same breed. Note that each participating beef team must provide their own animal and fitting rack.
b.	Clubs may put one team in each section but only one will count. The team counting for points must be
	decided and indicated on the club registration form.
с.	The time allotted per dairy team is 60 minutes. 5 minutes to look over the animal and 55 minutes
	preparation.
d.	In the event the sheep is not clipped, teams will be allotted 5 minutes to look over the animal and 40 minutes
	for fitting.
e.	Teams will consist of a maximum of three participants.
f.	Only one of the participants may be 21 years of age or over, as of the first of January of that year.
g.	No outside help is allowed; only the three participants may confer. Infractions will result in disqualification by
	the time-keeper.
h.	Participants are allowed to use the contents of one show box. The Box will be open for the judge to see,
	he/she may ask questions on the contents. All equipment including an extension cord should be supplied by
	the team.
i.	Each team will have access to one electrical outlet.
j.	If any breaker blows, there will be a time delay for someone to return the power
k.	Participants are not allowed to leave the fitting area after the time has started.
Ι.	Fitting on the head or below the hock will NOT be judged.
m.	For Sheep – there will be no electric clippers used, only hand shears. The animals will not have too much
	wool; "about one inch".
n.	For Beef- Optional to use clippers, glue, and paint.
	The time allocated for the beef fitting competition is 5 minutes to look over the animal and 30 minutes to fit.

7. Costume Class:

а.	Clubs may enter more than one entry; however, they must specify which counts for points prior to entering the ring.
b.	Each entry must contain an animal. Clubs without livestock may borrow an animal from another club, but it is suggested that these arrangements be made before Rally.
с.	 Each entry should meet the following criteria: 1. Minimum 1 participant aged 10 – 25 years. No limit on total number of participants. 2. Minimum 1 animal per club, maximum 3 animals. 3. At least 1 animal must be costumed. 4. All participants must be costumed. 5. Costumes must comply with current Rally theme. Each criterion met will award the club 10 points.

8. Livestock Competition:

a.	The choice of animal must be indicated on the project registration form and may not be changed within
	ten business days prior to the first day of Rally, except when an animal is sick, dies or is sold. In order to
	have an alternate animal count for points the participant must produce medical proof signed by a
	recognized veterinarian, or proof of sale, or other proof deemed acceptable by the executive
	committee
	prior to the close of registration on Thursday.
b.	Participants may register a maximum of 2 livestock projects.

с.	Animals will be checked by a vet(s) chosen by the host club as they are getting off the trucks; any animals
	with contagious diseases (a disease that can spread from one animal to another through direct or indirect
	contact) and any animals missing their ATQ tags (or the equivalent identification) will be sent home. The
	decision to send the animal home will be made by the chosen vet(s), and their decision is final. If a

e.	Animals, with the exception of nursing beef calves for which special arrangements can be made, must

	return. Requests to arrive late or leave early must be addressed to the Executive Committee at least 10

h.	The dairy judge must be accredited. The suggestions and final choice must come from the official judges list. The judge has the discretion to combine classes under the following circumstances. If there are less than 3

	animals in a class, those animals may be combined with a similar age within their breed. If there are less
	than 3 animals of a given breed, they may be combined with another breed which also has less than 3
:	animals. Showmanship classes will be divided into the following age intervals: 6-9, 10-11, 12-14, 15-17, 18-21, 22-25.

k.	When there are fewer than 3 Proven members showing an animal they will show in the finals of the Senior
	showmanship class. Proven members will be ranked by the judge amongst the Seniors and will be awarded
	points in accordance with those placings. Seniors ranked by the judge below any Proven member will be
	placed, receive ribbons and points as if the Proven members were not there.
١.	All participants must have a form of proof that the animal they are showing is the animal that they

с.	Life Skills Competition - Based on total marks, participants will be ranked within their age category and
	given points descending by 10 points per placing, 1 st place being 400 points.
d.	Judging Competition – There are six classes with placings worth 50 points each; four of those classes
	include reasons for an additional 50 points each. The Mystery and Identification classes are worth 100
	points each. The total possible for the Judging Competition is 700 points.
e.	Livestock Competition – Conformation Classes are worth 100 points and Showmanship Classes are worth
	300 points for a total possible 400 points for the Livestock Competition.
	Conformation Classes - All classes will be placed as follows: Top 10 with points descending by 5 points, 1 st
	place being 100 points. The remainder will be placed in B group for 40 points or C group for 30 points.

11. Points Systems for Group Competitions:

a.	Barn Display: Each club will place its animals in a designated space for the duration of the Rally. These club

	Decorations will be encouraged, but judges will be looking for quality, rather than quantity. Based on total		
	marks, clubs will be ranked and given points descending by 5 points per placing, 1 st place being 100 points.		
b.	Fitting Competition: Teams will be ranked with others fitting the same breed based on total marks. 100		
	points will be awarded for 1st place, 90 for 2nd and so on with points descending by 10 points per placing.		
с.	Costume Class: Teams will be awarded 10 points for each criterion met, up to a maximum of 50 points. No		
	partial points will be awarded.		
d.	Club Aggregate: This will be computed by taking the club's top 5 individual aggregate scores (12 – 25 years		
	old), barn display, costume class, and designated fitting score.		
e.	Bonus Points: Clubs will be awarded 10 points for each different project category the club enters up to a		
	maximum of 30 points.		

Any unforeseen circumstances will be dealt with by Executive Committee members that are not directly in conflict.

Parents/leaders/chaperones may be kicked off the grounds for inappropriate behaviour.
